
RANGE HILLS BAPTIST CHURCH // SUMMER 2020

Please note that we are reliant on every member of our church to help ensure that these policies are kept. Adhering to these polices helps us create a safe environment for all of our members.


Details are as follows:

- Sunday School starts at 9:30 am. Children and youth will meet in the back fellowship hall and adult Sunday School classes will be split between the middle fellowship hall and the Sanctuary. This will help ensure that we have adequate space for distancing and that we can clean each area easily after the meeting time.
- Sunday Morning Worship service will start at 10:45 am and the doors will open at 10:15 am. Members are asked to use the front fover entrance.
- Per local ordinance, masks are required at all services.
- We will continue to stream our Sunday morning services on Zoom. So, if you would like to join us that way you are welcome too.
- We will make sure that we are sanitizing all surfaces that are touched by members. To aid in this effort, hymnals and Bibles have been removed from the pews.
- Offerings will be collected in a box in the foyer. Members will also be encouraged to give online at rangehills.org



- To help members keep a good spacing in the Sanctuary, family units will be encouraged to sit apart from other family units and pews have been marked off so that members do not sit directly in front of or behind each other.
- At this time, we will continue Sunday Evening services, Wednesday evening services, nursery, children's church, choir, and van ministries at a later date when we can make sure that we can actively clean these areas. Also, during prayer you may be able to gain some insight and sense of direction.

Although having hope may not mean that things will turn out the way we want it to, trusting someone with our problems helps get a burden off of our shoulder.
